Response by Y.A. Dato' Abdul Hamid bin Hj. Mohamed At the Installation Dinner Of the President of the Rotary Club, Tanjung Bungah On 24th July 1993

UPON THE INVITATION of the Committee of the Rotary Club of Tanjung Bungah, upon eating the food served and upon hearing the beautiful music and the speeches made therein, <u>BY CONSENT IT IS ORDERED</u> that the Guests shall thank the Hosts for the sumptuous dinner <u>AND IT IS ORDERED</u> that the members of the Rotary Club Tanjung Bungah, their employers, agents, supporters and creditors shall pay the costs of this dinner.
